
FY1314 Penetration Rate w/ 1 SMHS by Race




FY1516 Penetration Rates w/ 1 SMHS by Race




FY1314 Penetration Rate w/ 1 SMHS by Gender




FY1516 Penetration Rates w/ 1 SMHS by Gender



FY1314 Penetration Rates w/ 1 SMHS by Age Group








FY1314 Penetration Rates w/ 5 SMHS by Age Group




FY1516 Penetration Rates w/ 5 SMHS by Age Group




FY1314 Penetration Rates 5+ SMHS by Race




FY1516 Penetration Rates w/ 5+ SMHS by Race



FY1314 Penetration Rates w/ 5 SMHS by Gender
























